VE Day Story from One of Our Pupils

My Great Grandad's story for VE day: Mr. Leslie Lemon – Great Grandad



He served at an anti-aircraft unit in Huntington and he was posted to the infantry, where in 1944 he crossed to Calais with the 4th Battalion of the Wiltshire Regiment. He was training to take part in the D-Day landings but was injured in training. Once he had recovered he was dropped further up the coast in France.

He marched through France, Belgium, Holland and across the Rhine into Germany. He was wounded in action in 1945 but quickly recovered and was able to continue marching. At the end of the war he was part of the liberation of the Belsen Concentration Camp, which was subsequently set up as a headquarters and renamed Home Camp.

He said: "When we first arrived some of the prisoners were still there in their striped PJs,

it's something that never leaves you, but I didn't see the worst of it. I left a lot of my comrades behind. I never expected to survive the war, and every day that I wake up I am so thankful".He was awarded Frances highest honour, the Legion D'Honneur medal in 2016 in recognition of his bravery in Europe in WW2.

We celebrated his 100th birthday with him on July 1st 2019 and he is still very independent. He lives at home and is an active member of his community, church and indoor bowls club.

Free School Meals

If you originally told us that you didn't want the Free School Meals package, which is provided by Hampshire Caterers (HC3s) from Herne's kitchen, and you would like to change your mind, that's not a problem! © Each package contains enough food for one child for five days' worth of lunches, e.g. bread, sandwich fillers, fresh fruit and salad items, yoghurts, drinks etc. All you need to do, if you are already eligible for Free School Meals, is email us on admin@hernejunior.com and we will make sure you are provided for.



We are increasingly aware of families having to access Universal Credits and other schemes to bring an income into the family household. It may be possible that you are now eligible for Free School Meals and the Local Authority could help you with lunches for your child or children in your household. Below is the link to apply for free school meals on HC3s' website. Free School Meal Vouchers

At this time, Herne is not using the voucher system for Free School Meals. The main reasons are that many schools and families are experiencing technical difficulties with these vouchers, leading to children not getting any food that they are entitled to. There is also widespread upset that several supermarkets are not accepting the vouchers and some reports are circulating where the vouchers are not being spent on food for the children.



Additional Exercise Books

We have had a few parent requests for an additional exercise book for their child to work in, because they have run out of room in their first book (impressive). We now have a special box under the canopy in front of the school office, where parents can pick up another book if their child needs one. Please only take one book per child. Thank you. ©

Handwashing Advice

It is essential that everyone washes their hands more often, using soap and water for at least 20 seconds. Hand washing with soap employs mechanical action that loosens bacteria and viruses from the skin, rinsing them into the drain. Drying hands afterwards makes the skin less hospitable to the virus. Hand sanitiser can be effective if soap is not available or the situation makes using soap less feasible (i.e. when outside) but using hand sanitiser provides none of the virus-destroying friction that rubbing your hands together and rinsing with water provides. Message from Petersfield Food Bank:

The PACT Food Bank based at the Salvation Army Hall in Swan Street, Petersfield, will be giving out food parcels to those in need, every week day, Monday – Friday between 9.30-11.30 am. Families will need to have a Referral Voucher, but can ask the Food Bank or Salvation Army volunteers for one and once filled in, this will immediately be exchanged for bags of dried and tinned food and any toiletries we have in stock. The families will also be given Food Vouchers which can be exchanged at the Petersfield market for Fruit & Veg and Bread, Cheese & Eggs.

If you have any concerns about getting to the Salvation Army to collect your emergency provisions, or you are in quarantine or self- isolation, please contact the food bank via their website so that they can organise an emergency delivery by a volunteer.
